Creating Safety and Security: Attachment and Early Childhood Education.

Young people with a history of trauma and attachment disruption tend to have difficulties. They may struggle academically, behaviourally, and socially. We tend to see their struggles in a number of ways: they may have a hard time fitting in or keeping up or even attending regularly. Early Childhood Educators are on the front line of supporting children with this kind of background and with these kinds of challenges. This workshop will invite us to look at working with young people who may be struggling, often as a result of attachment injuries and complex trauma histories. By connecting with children and paying attention to our relationship with them, we can better understand what it means for them to be attached, engaged and successful.
